Spring Boating Safety

Hello Boaters!

It is springtime, the weather is warm with a light breeze. This is the time for boaters to test the water. But before you start your boat, *SAFETY FIRST!* Here are some tips:

- 1. Learn to swim
- 2. Always wear a life jacket.
- 3. Take a boat safety course
- 4. Watch the weather
- 5. Remember alcohol and bating don't mix.

Too often pleasure outings turn into tragedies. You as the boat operator is responsible for everyone on your boat. Make sure everyone wears a life jacket. The USCG statistics indicate that on an average, over six (600) hundred people drown annually in boating accidents. About 88% could have survived if they wore a life jacket.

Have a vessel check done before you start navigating in any body of water!

Have a float plan when you go out. This important if you get lost, or you boat is delayed because of an emergency, or any other problems.

So have fun, enjoy!
