We had to move the "Fantasea" over the weekend of 24 May. Ken (number five son) needed lodging for his family in Hilton Head for, at least, the summer.

We got underway at 0900 on Saturday - - - down the Altamaha to Buttermilk Sound and out to sea via the Altamaha Sound - - - (mighty shallow water)—in preference to the ICW. At the 10 fathom line we headed up to 015 degrees to intercept Savannah River (Tybee Roads) channel, seas of 2 to 5 feet, wind SSW 10 knots. The Sky was glorious, with only an afternoon shower off St. Catherines. Normally, in the ICW, we would overnight in Buckhead Creek, but, offshore, we made such straight line distance that we opted to continue at our sedate 7 knots to Calibogue Sound.

Daufuskie Island was having an Oyster Roast and they hailed us to join in. Far be it for us to turn down such excellent food and company. At 1900 we were again underway to Broadcreek Marina. We were very fortunate to have both charts and local knowledge for the last ten miles to dockside. Arrival was at 2215, all powered up, secure, and ready to retire before midnight!

All considered, a pleasant, easy, and informative trip that bypassed all of the uncertainties of the "ditch".


A word of caution - - - the channel thru the Altamaha is not recommended except at high tide. We recorded 7 feet under the keep at we crossed the bar - - - Fantasea draws $4\frac{1}{2}$ feet. The charted depth, at MLW, is 5 feet, not a good place to be at low tide!

Passage Notes:

Jack Sterrett, AP has just returned in "Martini" after a trip to the Abacos lasting a little over a month. He and Jimmy Harrell from Milledgeville sailed outside to Fernandina Beach with the Power Squadron April 25 and continued down to Lake Worth on the ICW. George Bloodworth replaced Jimmy as crew May 2 and on May 5 they joined two other sailboats (one 23 feet and the other 25) and crossed to West End. The three boats toured the Abacos for three weeks and enjoyed near perfect winds and weather. In Spanish Cay the transmission cable on "Martini" unknowingly broke in forward, and when Jack tried to back her down she hit the dock. (Fortunately no one was hurt but the bowsprit is toast. Marsh Harbor stocked the replacement cable and the repair was done in a couple of hours.)

George flew home May 24 to be present at the birth of his first grandchild and Greg Phillip s replaced him as crew. Greg and Jack sailed straight from Mangrove Cay (catching 13 barracuda and two yellow-tailed snapper while still in the Bahamas) to Brunswick with a 10-15 knot west wind and without tacking once. They did turn on the engine after passing Fernandina Beach when the winds went below 4 knots. The 305 mile return trip took 53 hours, and the total mileage was 1102. A great crew, a good GPS, the Forbes guide to the Abacos, a great autopilot, and a strong anchor with plenty of chain made the trip especially enjoyable.
