

Administrative Offices Report Steve W. Batson, AP



Kathy and I missed the March squadron meeting because of a professional conference in New Orleans. This is the first time I have been back to New Orleans since Hurricane Katrina. The city has certainly suffered in many areas as it struggles to come back to life as the "Big Easy." I remember well the news footage of Coast Guard helos plucking persons off

rooftops around the city after the levies breached. Thank goodness our friends in blue were prepared for the task.

Similarly, we as boat owners must be prepared for any emergency in which we found ourselves. That preparedness starts each year with spring commissioning. We have a great marina crew who does the major work in this department for Kathy and me, but all of us should know what is needed and what has been done.

Our Vessel Safety Check (VSC) program covers all the bases. We need to insure that the following are in working

order: PFDs, visual distress signals, fire extinguishers, ventilation systems, lights and horn, radios, and navigation systems to name a few. Also, we should check dock lines, anchor rodes, galley and heating systems, first aid kits, charts (electronic and paper), and sanitation devices if relevant.

Most importantly, does your "crew" know how to get the vessel back to the dock if the captain is incapacitated? Remind me to tell you a scary conversation Kathy and I overheard from a wife to the Coast Guard from a disabled boat on the Delaware Bay. It started with "Help!"

On a program note, our May program will be a spokesperson from Coast Guard Station Brunswick to update us on all things Coastie. God bless this group on which we so strongly depend! It should be another good one.

Officially, the committees under the AO include Membership, Membership Involvement, Boating Activities, Meetings and Programs, Entertainment, Operations Training, and Leadership Development. As activities develop in any these areas, this column will report on them.
