

Although I had previously taken and taught all of the CG Auxiliary courses, taken the Sea School course, and am a licensed Captain, I found AP both interesting and challenging. The Advanced Grades

courses include Seamanship, Piloting, Advanced Piloting, Junior Navigation, and Navigation. In addition, there is a series of Elective Courses: Cruise Planning, Engine Maintenance, Instructor Development, Marine Electronics, Sail, and Weather.

If you complete at least Advanced Piloting and three Elective Courses, you receive the Educational Proficiency Award. If you complete all Advanced Grade navigational courses and all Elective Courses, you will receive the Educational Achievement Award, also known as the Senior Navigator Award. This outstanding series of courses results in a very proficient boater with strong seamanship and navigation skills. All of us should strive for this level of boating expertise as we engage in our favorite pastime. This counterbalances the "boaters" who question where the "bow" and the "stern" are! Safe boating through strong educational programs! Officially, the committees under the AO include Membership, Membership Involvement, Boating Activities, Meetings and Programs, Entertainment, Operations Training, and Leadership Development.
