Guests Al Barnes, George Champion, and Lewis and Phoebe Waynick were also introduced. Secretary Vicky Jefferis, AP, confirmed a Quorum was present. November meeting Minutes were approved. She thanked those who have volunteered for the Telephone Committee: Sara Grimshaw, Jeanne Klippel, Veronica Maguire, Lynda Sterrett, and Teresa Wilsdorf. Then she presented a summary of the Executive Committee meeting: XO Steve Batson, AP, reported that, based on our expenditures for educational materials in 2009, we can expect National to reimburse us up to about \$194 to for Co-op Advertising in 2010.

SEO Audie Holmes, JN, announced that the new America's Boating Course will be presented at the UGA Marine Extension Center each Tuesday in March from 7 – 9:30PM. For boaters needing a one day course, Boat Smart will be offered on the 4th Saturday in April. Two students completed the Boat Smart course offered in December and six have completed the requirements for Instructor Development.

Frank and Lynne Barron have had their grades upgraded to AP. Charles Wilsdorf, SN, added that three members are very close to completing the requirements for the Educational Proficiency designation and he will be working with them to attain this goal. He also mentioned that D26 has an Order of Mariners Award that can be achieved by earning

Educational Proficiency and 15 Merit Marks. The Bridge voted to buy the LCD projector we've been borrowing from Charles Wilsdorf since we foresee continued need for one. Provided an overview of the D26 Change of Watch Kickoff session hosted by Audie and Paulette at Marbella earlier in the day. Linda Mahoney will chair the Silent Auction Committee. Jeanne Klippel will chair the Spouse Program. Audie Holmes and Paulette Harris-Holmes will host the Sunday Brunch. Training Aid judging is held at the Fall Conference. OLD BUSINESS:



The Executive Department is responsible for the functions generally described as "external." Committees assigned to the executive department include boat show, cooperative charting, liaison, legislative, public relations, radio technical, safety, and vessel safety check.

Speaking of vessel safety checks, it will soon be time for us to consider checking our vessels for all of the safety requirements. I am always amazed that several items are recommended but not required. Two of those include a radio and an anchor! No self-respecting mariner would be caught dead without either. Many have two or three VHF radios on board (fixed and handheld). Long-distance cruisers supplement their VHF with SSB to monitor nets and other resources. Communication with other boaters and the Coast Guard is essential for safe boating.

I never trusted my boat-handling skills enough to function without an anchor. My boat has two anchors and enough rode to sink a battleship. If you end up dead in the water, you need an anchor. If you need to stop in a crowded location, you need an anchor. Break out the checklist and review conditions, dates, and other features of your equipment and your vessel. Bring everything up to par before the weather draws you out of the marina. Safe boating!
