Cdr Larry Jefferis, AP, called the meeting to order 24 April 2010at 6:55 PM. He provided the invocation, and Steven Chambless, S, led the Pledge of Allegiance. Larry introduced Past Commanders Paulette Harris-Holmes,



JN, Audie Holmes, JN, and John Rodgers, SN. New member Ralph Hanline and his spouse, Sandy, and guests Bob and Dee Morrison from the Jacksonville Power Squadron were introduced and welcomed

back. Cdr Jefferis then presented Audie Holmes his Certificate of Completion for a recent Operational Training course. Secretary Vicky Jefferis, AP, confirmed a Quorum was present. March Minutes were approved. Larry Jefferis reported that XO Steve Batson, AP, needs four volunteers (two for each two hour shift) for the GISPS display at West Marine and requests members wear PFDs for the membership meeting to kick off National Safe Boating Week on Saturday May 22. SEO P/C Audie Holmes, JN, announced that 14 students completed the new America's Boating Course and several of the five recent graduates of the Instructor Development course helped present the class. The next Boat Smart class will be held July 24 and plans for a Seamanship class are in the works – dates still TBD.

Old Business:

Cdr Jefferis asked all members to check their

status of membership renewal on USPS online. He asked everyone to renew their memberships in a timely manner and noted how it can be done very easily online. Those not renewing online should look for a paper invoice via regular mail.

Due to scheduling conflicts of the District 26 Bridge Officers, the GISPS Squadron Change of Watch has been changed from 13 to 20 November and the Squadron Calendar reflects the change. Larry mentioned that it's a quiet time for D26 Change of Watch preparations, but the proposed budget will be due in May or June. He thanked members for their Silent Auction donations and also thanked Joe Scirica, S, for the design idea for the boats to be used in the Friday night boat race.

There was no New Business.

To prepare everyone for the upcoming 8 May Coop Charting event, Stf/C John Rodgers, Assistant Chairman of USPS National Co-op Charting, SN, showed an informative video that covered the history of charting in the United States and the mission of NOAA. President Jefferson originally ordered a "survey of the coast" because transportation by water was so vital to the fledgling nation.

Because the importance of maintaining up to date charts and safe waterways has grown over the years, USPS has become an important partner with NOAA and the Coast Guard in identifying changes in US waterways and aids to navigation. Through USPS co-op charting activities, charts are updated far more often than they might otherwise be done.

John went on to explain that Squadron members will be focusing on checking the range markers located in local waters on our adopted NOAA chart 11506. Co-op Charting Chair Pat Rodgers, AP, announced that everyone planning to attend should meet at Golden Isles Marina at 10:00 AM. Bring lunch and drinks; also there will be a cookout after the cruise. Hamburgers will be provided, please bring a dish to share and your own drinks. Meeting adjourned at 8:50 PM.

District COW. I have lots of room, so keep those items coming.


This month's suggested donation item is: jewelry... Perhaps you create pieces/ or have some estate pieces you'd like to go to our worthy cause.
