Cdr Larry Jefferis, AP, called the meeting to order at 7:05 PM June 26, 2010. He provided the invocation and Bob Morrison, S, led the Pledge of Allegiance. Larry introduced Past Commanders John Rodgers, SN, and

Charles Wilsdorf, SN. New members Bob and Dee Morrison, S, from the Jacksonville Power Squadron and David Curtis, SN, from the Cape Cod Squadron have recently transferred to GISPS and were introduced and welcomed.

Secretary Vicky Jefferis, AP, confirmed a Quorum was present. May Minutes were approved. Treasurer Linda Mahoney, S, presented the Treasurer's Report. Balance on Hand as of 26 June is \$3,716.55 which includes income from recent member renewals.

Linda thanked several members for their donations and reminded everyone that we still need several more items to include in the D/26 Fall Conference Silent Auction. Proceeds will be

used to benefit the Squadron. She encouraged everyone to think about items to contribute.

Cdr Jefferis reported for the Administrative Officer, who is working, that the event at the Jekyll Island Marina was a great success. There were about 15 attendees, the weather held, and everyone had a great time.

XO Steve Batson, AP, announced he and Charles Wilsdorf will be working on a safety program for members in the near future.

A/SEO Charles Wilsdorf reminded everyone that the next Boat Smart class will be held July 24 at the UGA Marine Extension Center.

If anyone is interested, please respond soon. Charles also reported he administered Engine Maintenance tests to two members today.

Old Business:

Cdr Jefferis provided an update on the D/26 COW:

Jeanne Klippel has worked with the Jekyll Island Club and has the luncheon details in hand, along with a tour of the Historic District. Charles Wilsdorf has built a prototype of the boat to be used in the boat races and is ready to proceed with the updated engine mounting instructions. Cdr Jefferis will be meeting again with the Oceanfront Resort event/catering managers to confirm event details and set up a food tasting session to ensure meal quality.

New Business:

Pat Rodgers, AP, reported she will represent GISPS at the USPS Governing Board meeting in Seattle in September. Following that meeting, she and John will participate in a sixty boat cruise, so will prepare a program with lots of pictures for a future membership meeting. Pat also noted there is a beautiful classic schooner currently docked at the Golden Isles Marina, St. Simons Island. Meeting adjourned at 7:35 PM.


