Between my work and Kathy's recent surgery, we have yet to be on Georgia Lady this summer! Luckily, our marina crew keeps her well maintained even in our absence.

Unless you dock at your own private

pier or trailer, your marina is a very important element of your boating life. We have had good ones and not-so-good ones. Two elements are extremely important: (1) management attitude and capability and (2) communication.

One marina maintenance person in Alabama (to remain nameless) used to question every time I asked him to change the oil. "Why?" was his proverbial response. "Because I want it changed!" was my rejoinder. Occasionally he would reluctantly change the oil under duress! In my opinion, good marinas cater to their customers, go beyond the call of duty to properly maintain their vessels, put marina

and customer safety first, and support boating education and safety courses.

Of course, we customers have an obligation to be observant and cautious in the marina environment.

Another very important organization in our boating life is the U.S. Coast Guard. If you haven't recently seen it, go to U.S. Coast Guard Navigation Center website and review the myriad of resources for you – GPS and DGPS and AIS information, Local Notice to Mariners, Light Lists, and news and alerts. Stay up-to-date with relevant information. Be a good marina customer, and constantly be aware of your environment---who, what, where, when? Continue to enjoy summer boating!


