Treasurer's Report Teresa Wilsdorf, S Treasurer




GISPS currently has \$6,290.50 in the bank.

a variety of articles for very low prices. He's ordered from it, so the company has our logo and can embroider it on a large assortment of clothing. He said that our membership went from 57 to 68. We're making good progress toward our VSC goal and 20 VSCs were reported, including 2 more tonight. Two members took the Weather class in Augusta. Seven students are signed up for Seamanship. A Piloting class will be held in June and he is looking at a Weather and Engine Maintenance class

Cdr Vicky Jefferis said that she met with the attorney Ed Vinhaterio and the process to incorporate GISPS as a nonprofit organization is moving along. Our by-laws need to be updated and the Rules Committee will get going on that. For the Fernandina cruise, call Jack if you are going to be driving down. Savannah River will be hosting the D/26 Spring Cruise and Rendezvous on May 11-13.

Pat Rogers mentioned that a co-op charting cruise is planned the 4th week in May, but when reminded that that would be Memorial Day weekend, she will need to try a different week. She reminded all to always look for chart corrections. P/C Larry Jefferis, AP said to also look for correct items on charts, they can be reported as well.

The squadron Newsletter and web site were recognized by receiving the Distinctive Communicator Award. Vicky got the certificate for our 3rd place education award at the District Spring Conference and will scan it so it can be put onto our website.


