If you haven't brushed up your skills in a while, think about it. I want to tell you about my best experience with an America's Boating Club course. I believe in ongoing education, learning from (lots of) experience, and from interacting with a network of friends and community. The experience I want to share was "classroom and hands-on" sponsored by the Tybee Light Squadron. It's common for neighboring squadrons to open the more unique courses to members across the region to offer the opportunity to more people.

This was the Boat Handling Hands-on course. The other enthusiasts in the course were all levels and types of boaters. First, we had an evening classroom seminar where we went over the principles of hull against water, rudder and prop forces, planing and cavitation, docking methods. I've operated my own sailboat for 20+ years but - believe me – this theoretical refresher filled in a lot of cobwebs and cleared some space to try out some new practices.

But the thrill was the following day when we jumped in boats with Instructors and executed maneuvers repeatedly until we got them right. It was hard for a tiller sailboat skipper to adjust to a smaller boat, a wheel and much more power without a rudder! © But getting the feel of it, as compared to a sailboat, was "priceless". For that I am grateful to our friends at Tybee club for providing the opportunity.

I am inspired by the new offering we now have available online for learning / refreshing on Boat Handling!!! Really reasonable price, and it's much more fun and instructional than reading a book. If you spend your time and money, you want to walk away with new skills to try! America's Boating Club keeps producing new and different benefits for us, I encourage you to take advantage of them. 

#### District 26 Fall Conference and Change of Watch Changing in 2020


The year 2020 has certainly been a year like none most people have ever seen. Not only has it impacted our club's activities, it's had a major impact on the District 26 Fall Conference and Change of Watch scheduled for the weekend of October 30-31. Due to the threat of the coronavirus, it will not be conducted at a central site as is traditional. Instead, it will be conducted via a series of teleconferences to include some or all of the following topics: Seminars/Workshops; an awards teleconference to recognize member and Squadron recipients' of 2019 awards; Council/Conference teleconference to complete necessary business, such as approval of 2021 Budget, election of officers, etc. and a Change of Watch teleconference, officiated by C/C Mary Paige Abbott to accomplish the installation of the 2021 Bridge officers.

While disappointing that we won't get the opportunity to participate and see our friends from far away clubs in person, this approach of using virtual tools will allow many in our club to attend a seminar or ceremony from the comfort of our own homes. We can participate without having to travel to Columbia, South Carolina and it won't cost anyone a thing – no hotel, no meals, no registration fees.

A registration form will be developed and posted on the D26 Website to allow members to indicate the teleconference(s) he or she intends to participate in...this will allow teleconference moderators to know the number of people participating and determine the appropriate tools to reach everyone interested.

The District Planning Committee and Bridge are working to identify seminars that will appeal to ALL members, not just Bridge officers. This will be a great opportunity to have access to seminar content that our club may not be able to offer, so watch for more information over the summer.
